



**EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 27**

**REORGANIZING THE MUNICIPAL ANTI-DRUG ABUSE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ITOGON.**

**WHEREAS**, the local government of Itogon is fully supportive of the campaign of the national government to clear the country from illegal drugs to protect the present and future generations from its devastating effects and to maintain peace and order in the country consistent with the Constitutional provision mandating the government to promote the quality of life of every Filipino people;

**WHEREAS**, to effectively carry out all government actions to ensure a “Drug-Free Philippines,” there is a need for a continuing collaboration between public and private sectors including LGUs, concerned agencies of the national government, CSOs and other stakeholders in combatting the proliferation of illegal drugs in the country;

**WHEREAS**, the Municipal Anti-Drug Abuse Council takes the lead role in effecting all undertakings, plans and programs of the municipal government that complement the anti-illegal drugs campaign of the National Government in the local level;

**WHEREAS**, the relentless actions of the national government to rid the country of illegal drugs has heightened the morale, confidence and motivation of the municipality to be more aggressive in its anti-illegal drugs campaign with the unconditional support of our law enforcement bodies, other concerned agencies and private institutions in the implementation of our community-based prevention, treatment, rehabilitation and reintegration program;

**WHEREAS**, aside from the members of the Municipal Anti-Drug Abuse Council identified under Dangerous Drugs Board and DILG JMC No. 2018-01, it would be more beneficial to our cause to encourage the active participation of all stakeholders at the grassroots level by expanding the MADAC membership to include all Punong Barangays and the local Sanguniang Kabataan federation representative and other representatives from concerned sectors of the society whose field of interest is focused on moral recovery, psycho-social development, counseling and the like;

**NOW THEREFORE**, by virtue of the powers vested in me, I, **HON. BERNARD S. WACLIN**, in my capacity as Municipal Mayor of Itogon, Benguet Province, hereby reorganize the Municipal Anti-Drug Abuse Council of Itogon, to wit;

**Section 1. Composition.** The Municipal Anti-drug Abuse Council is hereby re-organized to be composed of the following:

Provided further that other sectoral representatives may be included as the MADAC may deem appropriate.

**Section 2. Roles and Responsibilities.** In accordance with DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2018-01, the Municipal Anti-drug Abuse Council shall perform the following roles and responsibilities:

1. On the part of the MADAC Chairman, attest the certification declaring the “drug-cleared” status of an affected barangay, certified by the Local Chief of Police and validated by the PDEA Regional Director;
2. Monitor the BADAC and BAT’s names, address and other significant details, copy furnished the DILG Field Office;
3. Receive the consolidated information report from BADAC Chair;
4. Review the consolidated reports of cluster leaders for final consolidation and submission to PDEA;

5. Maintain a list of endorsement or referral of Barangay Duty Officer as to who are drug dependents for screening using the Alcohol, Smoking and Substance Involvement Screening Test (ASSIST);
6. Establish one-stop-shop facilities where assessment, interview, counseling, referral and/or processing of applications for petitions for confinements of drug dependents and PWUD who surrendered for treatment and rehabilitation and other allied processes may be undertaken;
7. Designate a focal person who shall ensure the compliance and enforcement of DDB regulations on Voluntary Surrender of Drug Users and Dependents and shall coordinate with the appropriate service provider to assure compliance with the prescribed intervention;
8. Ensure that PWUDs who surrendered shall undergo screening in order to determine the level of risk and/or co-morbidities and refer them to the appropriate intervention;
9. Designate certain personnel as the authorized representatives of the DDB who shall cause the processing and filing of petitions for confinement of drug dependents and PWUD who surrendered for treatment and rehabilitation before the Regional trial Courts pursuant to sections 54 and 61 Of R.,A. 9165;
10. Organize the MADAC Drug Reformation Committee and adopt the Program of Instructions for Drug Reformation Program;
11. Provide for the Community-based Rehabilitation Program. As such, it shall (a.) lead the formulation of the plan of action for community-based treatment and support services on the prevention of drug abuse in communities, in coordination with other members of the network of the LGU; (b.) monitor all IEC materials on the campaign, "Sa Droga, Talo Ka, ACHIEVE and PAGBABAGO!" to be adopted by primary care facilities in advocating for the promotion and prevention of drug abuse in communities, as approved by DOH Health Promotion and Communication Service with DOH DDAPTP and concurred in by DDB; and (c.) submit the reports of Data on Community-Based Treatment and Rehabilitation, and Data on Drug Treatment, Rehabilitation, and Aftercare of Drug Dependents thru the Anti-Drug Abuse Council Reporting System (ADAC-RS) as integrated in the Integrated Drug Monitoring and Reporting Information System (IDMRIS) of DDB;
12. Conduct advocacy and/or preventive education seminars, giving emphasis to the role of parents and children in the anti-drug campaign, ill effects off drugs, and consequences of drug abuse. This includes the conduct of lectures on the proper procedures on rehabilitation of drug dependents and PWUDs who surrendered pursuant to R.A. 9165 and pertinent DDB regulations, counseling program for families with drug dependents and PWUD who surrendered to cope up with the trauma;
13. Perform other duties and functions as may be provided by law, ordinances or issuances by competent authorities.

**Section 3. Secretariat.** There is hereby designated a secretariat to provide administrative and technical support services which shall be likewise responsible for the

documentation of all proceedings, meetings and other related activities of the MADAC, preparation of notices and to perform other related functions. Furthermore, the secretariat shall collate all reports and maintain periodic statistics on barangay drug-clearing operations for evaluation/analysis and continuing enhancement of processes and procedures. The secretariat shall be composed of the following:

**Section 4. Support Fund.** Expenditures for the operation of the Council shall be provided in the General Fund under the Mayor's Office appropriated for the purpose and from the Assistance to Individuals in Crises Situation fund under the MSWDO for voluntary drug rehabilitation program. Provided further, that maintenance and other operating expenditures maybe sourced out from any available appropriations for other related programs in support of the prevention, rehabilitation and treatment, and reintegration program of the municipality.

**Section 5. Repealing Clause.** All Executive Orders or parts thereof inconsistent herewith or parts hereof are deemed repealed and/or modified accordingly.

**Section 6. Effectivity.** Order shall take effect immediately.
